## **REPORT CARDS**

Report Cards come home Friday, January 10. Please check them over carefully, and call with any questions. Your child's teacher will be happy to review any information with you.

Remember, a general guideline for the reporting scale on the report card for the academic indicators (4, 3, 2, 1) are generally as follows:

- 4 MASTERED: The student consistently and independently meets the grade level standard and consistently understands and applies the concept/skill learned.
- 3 PROGRESSING: The student independently meets the grade level standard, demonstrating secure understanding of the concept/skill and its application with a minimal number of errors.
- 2 BEGINNING: The student demonstrates a basic understanding of the concept/skill, but application is inconsistent, and the student regularly needs support from the teacher.
- 1 OF CONCERN: Limited or no understanding of the concept/skill taught, and requires substantial support from the teacher.

N/A - NOT ASSESSED: N/A or left blank indicates that the concept/skill has not been assessed at the current grading period.

#### Attendance in December

During the month of December, we had 145 students receive their attendance charm for their story necklace. These students missed 0 or only 1 day of school for the month. Mrs. Winslow's class had the best attendance percentage for December, and her class has earned a pizza party! We encourage our kids to come ON TIME, EVERY DAY, but certainly understand the need to be absent when they are truly sick!

<u>ATTENDANCE</u> (from the American Academy of Pediatrics/www.healthychildren.org)

Missing just two days a month of school—for any reason— can be a problem for kids. Children who are chronically absent in Kdg. & 1st grade are less likely to read on grade level by 3rd grade. For older students, being chronically absent is strongly associated with failing at school—even more than low grades or test scores. When absences add up, these students are more likely to be suspended & drop out of High School, and can be linked with teen substance abuse and poor health.
