We will explore political, social, economic, and cultural events that contributed to the creation of the multicultural society that has shaped the United States. We will analyze key issues such as the changing relationships between government and the governed; the era of exploration; the settlement and colonization of North America; the growth of a strong central state; the American Revolutionary War, the Declaration of Independence, the creation and adoption of the United States Constitution, and how/why Americans spread all the way across the continent of North America.
