

# Positive Behavior Interventions and Support P.B.I.S.



### What is Positive Behavior Interventions and Support?

Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS) is a proactive systems approach for creating and maintaining safe and effective learning environments in schools. PBIS ensures that all students have the social/emotional skills needed to ensure their success at school and beyond. The focus is to develop structure for teaching expected behaviors and social skills, creating student behavioral and academic support systems, and applying data based decision-making to discipline, academics and social/emotional learning.


Schools that implement PBIS with integrity and durability have teaching and learning environments that are:

- \* Less reactive, aversive, dangerous, and exclusionary.
- \* More engaging, responsive, preventive, and productive.
- \* Address classroom management and disciplinary issues (attendance, tardies, and antisocial behavior)
- \* Improve supports for students whose behaviors require more specialized assistance (emotional and behavioral disorders)
- \* Most importantly, maximize academic engagement and achievement for all students.

### North Mac Middle School Rules and Behavior Expectations

The three expectations are Be Safe, Be Respectful, and Be Responsible.

- 1. Hallways- stay to the right, walk facing forward and slow, move to class quickly so that you are not tardy.
- 2. Lockers- Do not slam lockers, keep the locks on them at all times, do not stick an object in the latch because students may steal objects from your locker, keep your voices down when at your lockers, please clean your locker out so that you can stay organized and so it will shut correctly. Do not write on the outside of your lockers. Give students enough room to get in their lockers.
- 3. Bathroom- Wash hands with soap, dry your hands and throw your trash away. Respect privacy of others, turn off the water, flush toilets, be quiet in the bathroom- it is not a time to socialize. Do not urinate on the floor or seats of the toilets. Ladies dispose napkins in their proper containers. Do not write on the walls.
- 4. Cafeteria- Do not run when entering the cafeteria, keep hands and feet to yourself, stay in line, use a low tone of voice (no yelling), use table manners (no belching or passing of gas.) eat your own food (please do not share.) Throw all trash in the garbage can. Make sure they follow the supervisor's instructions. Make sure they stay to the right when they leave with a low tone of voice. They should be in a single file line.
- 5. Classroom- Each teacher control the rules in their classroom, Respect others and yourself, Be on time, Be prepared with all materials, follow directions, have an agenda and an A.R. book at all times. If the rules are not followed they will receive a detention or worse.
- 6. Assemblies & School Events(Games)- No running!!!!! Enter and exit gym slowly, Walk slowly in the bleachers, listen and watch the game/speaker (no talking), follow directions, show appreciation, thank the guest speaker for coming. When dismissed leave in an orderly fashion. Please remind students to walk up the stairs and down the stairs when entering and leaving the gym. (do not walk on the bleachers.) Keep feet and hands to yourself.
- 7. Buses- Stay in your seat and face forward, use a low tone of voice (no yelling), no food or drink, follow bus driver's rules and respect the bus driver, keep materials in your bag, clean up area and dispose in the trash. No profanity, keep hands, feet, and rude comments to yourself.
- 8. Arrival and departure- Stay to the right, use a low tone of voice when entering the building, remove hats, no running, hold doors for others, respect the crossing guard, no one at their locker before school. Report to the old gym or to the cafeteria for breakfast. Leave the building when school is over. Please do not stick around unless you have an academic obligation, sports, or a detention.





### Ron Clark's "Essential 55 Rules"

- 1. Respond to an adult when spoken to. "Yes ma'am or "No sir."
- 2. Make eye contact when spoken to.
- 3. Congratulate classmates when they win or do something well.
- 4. Respect other students' comments, opinions, and ideas.
- 5. If you win, do not brag, if you lose, do not show anger.
- 6. If you are asked a question in conversation, ask a question in return.
- 7. Cover your mouth when you sneeze or cough and say excuse me. Germ-x hands.
- 8. Do not show disrespect with gestures. (Ex: smack your lips or roll your eyes.)
- 9. Always say thank you when given something.
- 10. When you receive something, do not insult the gift or the giver
- 11. Surprise others by performing random acts of kindness.
- 12. When grading other students' papers, give only the correct grade.
- 13. Follow along when we read together in class.
- 14. Answer all written questions with a complete sentence.
- 15. Do not ask for a reward.
- 16. You must complete your homework every day.
- 17. Subject transitions and moving to different classrooms will be swift, quiet, and orderly.
- 18. Be as organized as possible.
- 19. When homework is assigned, do not moan or complain.
- 20. When a substitute teacher present, all class rules still apply.

- 22. You may bring a bottle of water to class; you may not leave for a drink of water during class.
- 23. Know other teachers' names and greet them in the hall by name.
- 24. Keep yourself and the bathroom clean and germ-free.
- 25. Greet visitors and make them feel welcome.

- 27. Do not stare at a student who is being reprimanded.
- 28. Call me if you have a question about homework and leave a message –once.
- 29. The ABC's of etiquette.

- 32. When meeting new people shake hands and repeat their names.
