- 5. arteriosclerosis hardened arteries with reduced elasticity.
- 6. angina pectoris chest pain that results when the heart does not get enough oxygen.
- 7. arrhythmias irregular heartbeats.
- 8. stroke an acute injury in which blood flow to the brain is interrupted.
- 9. cancer uncontrollable growth of abnormal cells.
- 10.tumor abnormal mass of tissue.
- 11.benign noncancerous.

- 13.metastasis the spread of cancer from the point where it originated to other parts of the body.
- 14.carcinogen a cancer-causing substance.
- 15.biopsy the removal of a small piece of tissue for examination.
- 16.remission cancer is either gone or under control.
- 17.allergy a specific reaction of the immune system to a foreign and frequently harmless substance.
- 18.histamines chemicals that can stimulate mucus and fluid production.
- 19.asthma an inflammatory condition in which small airways in the lungs become narrowed, causing difficulty in breathing.
- 20.diabetes a chronic disease that affects the way body cells convert sugar into energy.

- 21.autoimmune disease a condition in which the immune system mistakenly attacks itself, targeting the cells, tissues, and organs of a person's own body.
- 22.arthritis a group of more than 100 different disease that cause pain and the loss of movement in the joints.
- 23.osteoarthritis a disease of the joints in which cartilage breaks down.
- 24.rheumatoid arthritis a disease characterized by the debilitating destruction of the joints due to inflammation.
