

#### Notes:

- 1. ESSER II, \$1,310,000, was used directly for salaries of current employees. That created the ability to us this same amount from the Education Fund in FY 2023. This can be done by dedicating that amount from the FY 2023 GSA payments to the \*Capital Fund and \*\*HLS Fund.
- 2. ESSER III, \$3,060,413. Two expenditures take up the proceeds of this grant:
  - A. \$735,000 of indirect funds to be used for current employees in FY2023. Same scenario as described above in #1 can be used here. If needed, \$735,000 could be directed from GSA into the Capital Fund to help offset the New Gym.
  - B. \$2,325,413 of this grant has been dedicated directly and strictly for use on the replacement of the South Campus HVAC system.
- 3. Working Cash Fund should be seen as the safety net for the Education Fund in the next two years. As long as state funding is fully funded, there should be no issues with this funding roadmap for these three projects, as well as making sure the other funds remain healthy.
- 4. With the roughly \$1,500,000 in Working Cash Funds, and the breathing room of \$735,000 of indirect funds from ESSER III, as long as the gym project stays in the GRAND TOTAL \$7,000,000 to \$7,500,000 range, funding for all accounts should remain strong.
- 5. NOTE: Be aware that it is quite possible, depending on how the FY23 budget is crafted, the district may see another one-year slip in the Illinois School District Financial Profile rating. As we have seen, this is nothing to worry about. Remember that up until FY2021 we were always in the Recognition category. In FY2021 we deliberately created a large deficit in our Education Fund to help fund building projects and as a result we were put in the Watch category. As projected, in FY2022 we were right back to the Recognition status. Don't let this arbitrary and pointless rating from the ISBE deter you from using your financial resources in a manner you see fit and that you believe is in the best interest of the school district.
