3. Communications

4. Public Comment

Angela Williamson stated that she would like to see the 5.5 million used to make upgrades at South Campus. Williamson believes that money needs to be spent on other things than a gym and administrative offices. Money needs to be spent on upgrades for students.

Terry June spoke regarding concerns for students related to quarantine. June asked why there was no Test to Stay program in place at the beginning of school. June asked why the Superintendent doesn't live in the District. June states that he emailed/texted all board members to no avail. June feels that Dr. Goble retaliated to their lawsuit by taking the High School fully remote for learning and stopping all sports.

Deb Marsaglia thanked Mr. Downs and Ms. Anderson for the help she has received during her time subbing. Marsaglia wanted the board to know how hard the Administration and teachers are working. Marsaglia also urged board members to walk thru the school to see all that's going on.

Chris Hatalla apologized for the threats made to board members. That was not the intention. Hatalla wanted to keep healthy kids in school. Hatalla wanted a meeting but that didn't happen. Hatalla feels like the district could have done more and didn't.

Hatalla stated that other school districts in our county didn't quarantine students like North Mac did. Hatalla urges North Mac to have strong leadership. Strong leadership leads to strong results.

Jeremy White had questions for the board. Is any CARES or ESSR money dependent on masking or vaccination mandates? Will the board vote to not enforce the vaccination/testing mandate for staff. White states that North Mac is violating the Health Care Right of Conscience Act. White states a vote of no confidence could be possible. Adam Perce indicated that he is disappointed by the lack of response from the board. Perce asked if the board has given up power to Superintendent. How are all votes unanimous? Perce also wanted to know if any of the CARES or ESSER funds would be going to the construction of the new gym at the High School.

Debbie Butler urged the board to reconsider refunding bonds. Butler would like to see this as a referendum for the community to be able to say what they want to spend money on.

7. New Business

- 7.1 Motion was made by Christopher, seconded by Alexander to approve the application for cooperative team sponsorship between North Mac CUSD and Waverly CUSD for high school girls' soccer. Kirk asked if we knew that Franklin was involved as well as Waverly and if that would have any impact on class. Raynor stated that didn't know Waverly already co-oped with Franklin but it would change class. We will still be in the 500's and would need to reach 697 to bump to 2A. Alexander asked about possibility of co-op extending to boys soccer. Raynor indicated that the Waverly/Franklin boys' soccer team had entered into a 2 year contract with the facility they are using. I love my job as a kindergarten teacher but right now, I am NOT proud teacher of North Mac. I shy away from wearing my North Mac gear because I don't like getting bombarded with questions about what is going on in our district. And the worse part is, it is not just ONE thing people are talking about, it's several things. We could blame it all on COVID but COVID is a virus and what's plaguing our District is not the virus. It is much worse than that. Our district is being plagued by vindictiveness, half-truths, political views and social media. Sadly, this plague has taken away the focus of what all schools should be about---the students and their education. It took a court case to get our HS students back in the classroom. It was sad that it had to be taken that far, but it worked out and our focus was back on track. But it wasn't long before another incident took place and learning was yet again interrupted. Half-truths and social media played a HUGE role in this situation. Teachers are employees of the district. With employment comes requirements and expectations, just like other places of employment. Unlike most places of employment teachers are afforded tenure rights and the opportunity to join the teacher union. I never really thought of these two things as "perks" like people outside the teaching field often do. After events that have taken place, I can now see what others have been saying and I am sad and disgusted. Everyday in my kindergarten classroom we read THE PANTHER PACT

My goal today is to be safe, respectful, and responsible. I will make sure I am safe and my friends are safe. I will show respect to my teachers, classmates, parents, and everyone I meet. I will be responsible and work hard to learn as much as I can. If I make a mistake, I will accept the consequences without anger and try harder the next time to become a leader for my school, my community, and my country.

My kindergarten students know that these are not just words that we say everyday...they are words to live by. I think as teachers, administrators, board members and community members we can learn from this, just like my 5 year-old students.

We have got to bring back our focus – students and their education. Until we do this, we are never going to do what we need to do – create leaders for our school, our community and our country!
